REFLECTION

LITANY OF REMEMBRANCE

This first candle we light to remember those whom we have loved and lost. We pause to remember their name, their face, their voice, the memories that bind them to us in this season. [Pause while the first candle is lit.]

We remember them with love. May God's eternal love surround them.

This second candle we light is to redeem the pain of loss: loss of relationships, loss of trust, loss of jobs, loss of health, loss of faith, the loss of joy. We pause to gather up the pain of the past and offer it to you, O God, asking that into our wounded hearts and open hands You will place the gift of peace, shalom. [Pause while the second candle is lit.] We remember that through You all things are possible.

This third candle we light is to remember ourselves this Christmas time. We pause and remember these past weeks and month; the disbelief, the anger, the down times, the poignancy of reminiscing, the hugs and handshakes of family and friends, all those who stood with us. We give thanks for all the support we have known. [Pause while the third candle is lit.]

Let us remember that dawn defeats darkness.

This fourth candle we light to remember our faith and the gift of hope which the Christmas story offers us. We remember that God who shares our life promises us a place and time of no more pain and suffering. [Pause while the fourth candle is lit.] We remember the One who shares our burdens, who shows us the way to the Light, and who journeys with us into all our tomorrows.
